Established in 2001, the Reserve Advisory Council provides advice and recommendations to NOAA's Office of National Marine Sanctuaries. The council is composed of nine government and 14 non-governmental representatives. Serving in a volunteer capacity, the council members represent a variety of local user groups, as well as the general public. Reserve Advisory Council primary and alternate members serve three-year terms and meet four times per year in public sessions.

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
