Our Sea of Islands, A Regional Forum for Oceania on Marine Managed Areas and World Heritage will be held in Honolulu, January 29-February 2, 2007. With the exception of the public event and reception on February 1, Forum participation is limited to invited participants.

WHAT: NOAA, UNESCO and pacific island leaders are working together to demonstrate their commitment to marine conservation in the Pacific. Delegates from over 20 Pacific nations, including Hawaii, Solomon Islands, Cook Islands, Fiji, Samoa and the Federated States of Micronesia will come together to enhance natural and cultural heritage and management of marine protected areas.

The recent designation of the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands Marine National Monument provides a catalyst for building partnerships and strengthening capacity to address the distinct heritage and marine management needs of island communities.
