- 1) Papahānaumokuākea Marine National MONUMENT, located in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands, is the largest protected area in the country - bigger than all national parks combined!
- 2) The HUMPBACK WHALE is a PROTECTED species.
- 3) Papahānaumokuākea is a place of great cultural significance to NATIVEHAWAIIANS.
- 4) The Hawaiian MONKSEAL is the most endangered MARINE MAMMAL in the world.
- 5) Most Hawaiian green SEATURTLES go to French Frigate Shoals in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands to nest.

- 6) There are 7,000 SPECIES in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands, including THREATENED and ENDANGERED plants and animals.
- 7) Some organisms found in Hawai'i are ENDEMIC, meaning they live nowhere else in the world!
- 8) Each year, more than 50 tons of MARINEDEBRIS are removed from the Monument.
- 9) Abandoned fishing gear is an **ENTANGLEMENT** hazard to marine life.
- 10) CLIMATECHANGE is one of the key threats to Papahānaumokuākea, causing sea level rise that impacts animals' nesting areas, warmer water temperatures that cause CORALBLEACHING, and more intense/frequent storms.
- 11) You can help by participating in a beach CLEANUP and other activities.
