## **MSA National Standards**

Principles by which management programs are developed:

- 1. Prevent overfishing while achieving OY
- 2. Use best scientific information available
- 3. Stocks managed as units
- 4. Cannot discriminate between residents of different states
- 5. Consider efficiency
- 6. Take into account variations and contingencies
- 7. Minimize costs, avoid duplication
- 8. Consider communities
- 9. Minimize bycatch and mortality
- 10. Promote safety of human life at sea






How are fishery regs developed?


