- 1) Papahānaumokuākea Marine National **MONUMENT**, located in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands, is the largest protected area in the country - bigger than all national parks combined!
- 2) The **HUMPBACK WHALE** is a **PROTECTED** species.
- 3) Papahānaumokuākea is a place of great cultural significance to **NATIVE HAWAIIANS**.
- 4) The Hawaiian **MONK SEAL** is the most endangered **MARINE MAMMAL** in the world.
- 5) Most Hawaiian green **SEATURTLES** go to French Frigate Shoals in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands to nest.
- 6) There are 7,000 **SPECIES** in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands, including **THREATENED** and **ENDANGERED** plants and animals.
- 7) Some organisms found in Hawai'i are **ENDEMIC**, meaning they live nowhere else in the world!
- 8) Each year, more than 50 tons of **MARINE DEBRIS** are removed from the Monument.
- 9) Abandoned fishing gear is an **ENTANGLEMENT** hazard to marine life.
- 10) **CLIMATE CHANGE** is one of the key threats to Papahānaumokuākea, causing sea level rise that impacts animals' nesting areas, warmer water temperatures that cause **CORAL BLEACHING**, and more intense/frequent storms.
- 11) You can help by participating in a beach **CLEANUP** and other activities.
