The proposed activity would... operate the Oscar Elton Sette, a 224' National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) research vessel within the boundaries of the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument. The mission of this vessel is to provide an at sea research support platform for NOAA research activities. Research scientists aboard the vessel will work under separate permits.
